#### RUSSIA'S PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE

DEAR ATTENDERS:

**T**HROUGH the efforts of Harry Shaw, we are to have as our guest and speaker, Friday, Count Ilya Tolstoy, son of Leo Tolstoy, the great Russian writer and reformer. Count Tolstoy, who is touring the United States with his secretary, Mr. V. N. Kotlezoff, lieutenant of the Russian navy, will speak on "Russia's past, present and future," and is expected to vividly describe Russia's progress and development in the past, the horrors of the present and to picture the possibilities of the future.

Count Tolstoy is devoting his time at present to helping his countrymen. He is no novice in relief work having worked in Russian villages with his father in 1891-2 and again in 1898

when Russia was stricken with famine. Rotarians should not miss this opportunity to hear this well known Russian.
