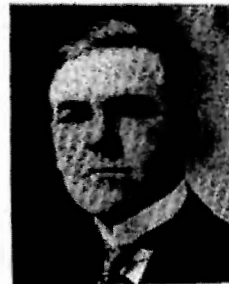

SIX CHARTER MEMBERS TO HAVE CHARGE

DEAR TEN-YEAR-OLDS:

ON April 13, 1913, ten years ago, the Rotary Club of Albany was organized. It was the sixty-eighth club in Rotary and its birth was largely due to the efforts of George S. DeRouville, who became its first secretary. The seven charter members were George, Charles M. Winchester, Ben V. Smith, Oscar F. Kinney, Charles C. DeRouville, Thomas J. McMahon and Gardner C. Leonard. The latter passed away April 15, 1921.

Much has happened in the past decade. From a charter membership of seven we have grown to an organization of 200, and Rotary Interna-

tional has 1,390 clubs. We have admitted 326 members. Of these, 23 have died; 47, whose memberships have been terminated by resignation or otherwise, are still in Albany; 56 have left the city. So far as known, 6 of the latter are members of other Rotary clubs.

The ten presidents in order of their election were Ben V. Smith, Charles M. Winchester, George D. Elwell, William G. Furlong, Edgar M. Griffiths, George S. DeRouville, George William McEwan, Jacob H. Herzog, Harlan H. Horner and Charles C. DeRouville. The club has twice been honored by the selection of its mem-
